Fabric: Your choice

Backstitching:

Bat fangs – 1 strand of blanc

Pumpkin vines & stems – 1 strand of 433

Spider web – 1 strand 310

All other backstitch – 1 strand 310

Do NOT stitch address lines, for placement only

French Knots:

All eyes – 1 strand of 310, wrapped 3 times

Finishing:

How to make your envelope:

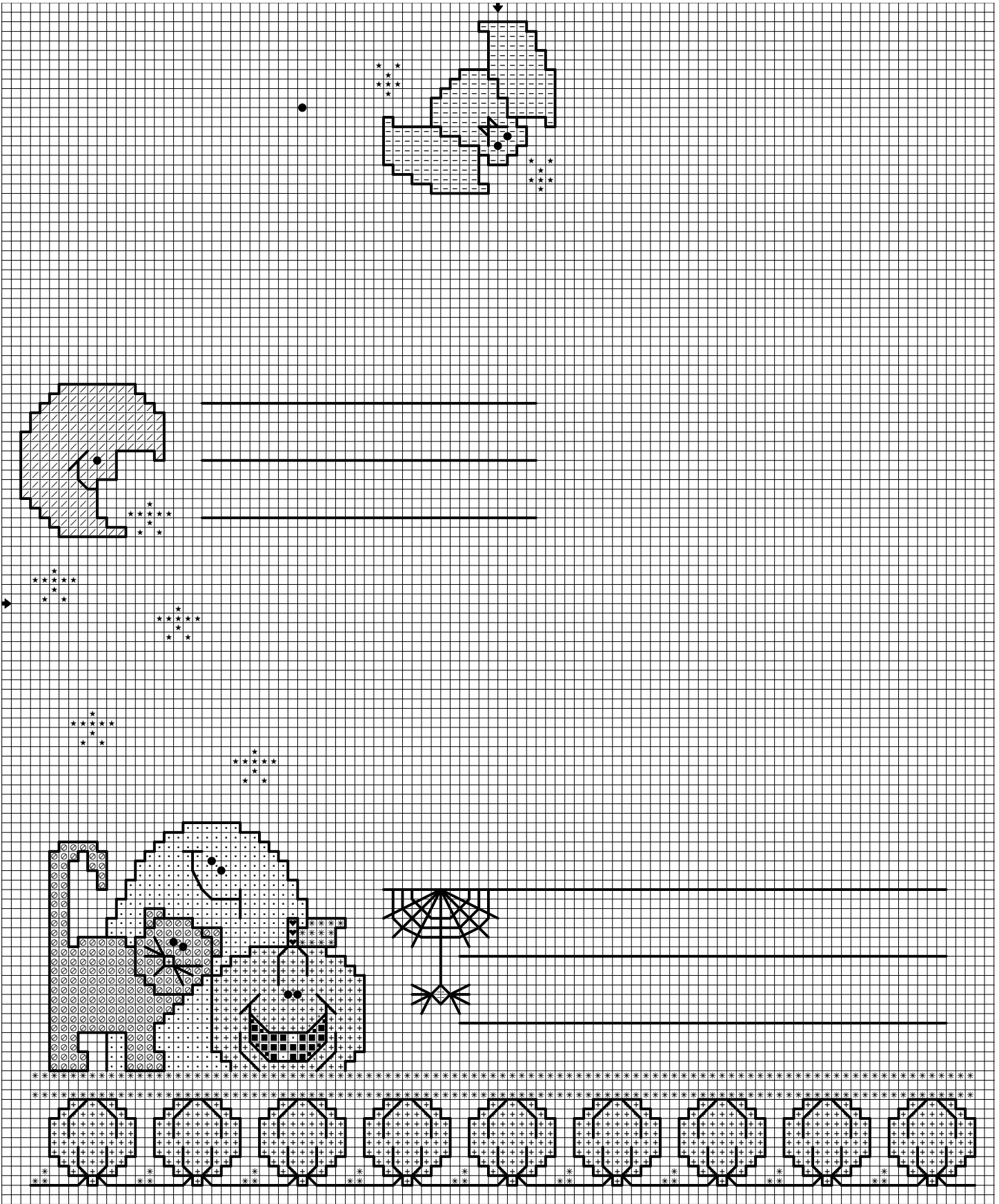
You will need 1 inch of fabric above the bat. You will need 3 inches of fabric below the small pumpkins. Your fabric when cut, should measure 7 1/2" wide by 14 1/2" long.

Place stitching with finished design facing down. On the edge with the pumpkins fold up 1/4 inch. Press this fold and stitch down by hand or machine.

Turn your fabric over so design is now facing you. Fold the fabric at 5". This should make your finished hem edge now even with the top of your return address. The fold line should be between the two rows of grass. Stitch up both sides 1/4" in from edge. Your stitching should be very close to the design. Turn Right Side Out.

To make the back flap. With the design facing you. At the top edge, fold the fabric in half. The top right and left corner will meet and you will stitch across the top 1/4" in from edge. Turn right side out and you should now have the point for your flap.

You should now have an envelope. Insert your card into your envelope and check with your local post office for advise on postage before mailing.



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
